We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2021-2022 educational progress for Clawson High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-2022 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-2022. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-2022. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-2022. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Clawson High School HAS NOT BEEN GIVEN ONE OF THESE LABELS.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Students are assigned to Clawson High School by residential area and/or by choice. Schools of Choice honored if there is a seat available.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

Clawson High School continues to attend to the goals of our School Improvement Plan which is aligned to the district Strategic Plan. The Strategic Plan identified two areas of effort: SEL and Literacy/math. The Clawson High School Improvement Plan addresses these 2 areas and we have identified other areas on which to focus our efforts: Academic Excellence, Well-Being, Critical Thinking/ Problem Solving and Community Involvement and Pride. We believe these goals will improve our student achievement in all areas.

3. A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

We do not have specialized schools.

Clawson Public Schools uses i-Ready for local assessments. We assess students in Reading and Math. This assessment data informs our school decisions about placement in intervention classes and small group instruction.

6. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Clawson High School offers Fall and Spring conferences. 27% of the students were represented by a parent at Fall conferences. 10% of students were represented by a parent at Spring conferences.

- a. THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENTS (DUAL ENROLLMENT)-

Clawson High School , in the 2021-2022 school year, had 20 students dual enrolled which is 5.1% of the total population.

- b. THE NUMBER OF COLLEGE EQUIVALENT COURSES OFFERED (AP/IB)-

Clawson High School does not offer Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate classes on campus. Clawson High School coordinates with the Center for Advanced Studies and the Arts (CASA) to offer sixteen (16) Advanced Placement courses to students. In the 2021-2022 school year, Clawson High School had 22 students enrolled, which is 5.6% of the total population.

- c. THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN COLLEGE EQUIVALENT COURSES (AP/IB)-

Clawson High School does not offer Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate classes on campus. Students enroll in the Center for Advanced Studies and the Arts (CASA) to offer sixteen (16) Advanced Placement courses to students. In the 2021-2022 school year, Clawson High School had 22 students enrolled, which is 5.6% of the total population.

- d. THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS RECEIVING A SCORE LEADING TO COLLEGE CREDIT-

Clawson High School does not offer Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate classes on campus. Students enroll in the Center for Advanced Studies and the Arts (CASA). Scores leading to college credit are reported to CASA and the individual student.

We are happy to share these results with our community and encourage you to visit the AER site and explore the data. The goal of Clawson Public Schools is for each child to achieve his/her fullest potential. The principals and teachers in our schools review and analyze several sets of student performance data and collaboratively select strategies designed to improve the learning for all students.
